



Work Safely

When you tackle a job it is important to work safely. Please consider the following points when building your Fruit Cage.

- Keep your work area tidy. A tidy site is a safe site.
- Use the correct tools for the job.
- Wear gloves where practical. Components may have sharp edges.
- Take care when using tools such as hammers, drill, knife, scissors.
- Consider other people, particularly children.

Tools Required

You will require a few tools to assemble your Fruit Cage which are usually available in most households.


- Hammer
- Cordless drill


- Tape measure
- Scissors or craft knife

• 13mm spanner or socket

Procedure

- 1. Choose a flat and level area to site your Fruit Cage and mark out the four corners of the Fruit Cage, ideally with string-lines.
- 2. With the ground tubes, make a 2m square "grid".







3. Hammer the swaged ground tubes into the ground until the shoulder of the swage is 5-6cm above ground level. Use a piece of wood on top of the ground tube to ensure that the tube does not become "mushroomed".

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
4. Slot a 185cm long tube onto each swaged ground tube.






5. Start the assembly of the top framework with a corner fitting . . .


6. Then a straight tube with an intermediate fitting (for greater than 2m long) . . .



8. Work from the first corner with a straight tube and intermediate fitting (for Fruit Cages wider than 2m) . . .





7. Finish along one side with a straight tube and corner fitting.






9. For Fruit Cages wider <u>and</u> longer than 2m, two straight tubes and a centre cross.






10. Continue until the frame is complete.

11. Assemble the door. Lay the components out on a flat surface and assemble with the fittings in the positions as shown. (Exploded view from <u>inside</u>.)






- 12. Fix the door corners to the straight tubes with the self-drill screws using a cordless drill.
- Self-drill screws in 4 places
- 13. Fix the door assembly to the Fruit Cage framework with the KH25 fittings and M8 x 30 set screws and nylock nuts.
- 14. Fit the magnetic latch to the door with 2 x self-drill screws. Adjust the post so that the magnet latches securely to it.






- 15. The side netting is supplied on a 2m long roll. With the roll stood on end, unroll the side netting around the perimeter of the fruit cage and attach to each post with a few cable ties.
- 16. Fix the top net *at each corner* with cable ties. (By doing this the net is pulled to the correct size.)



17. Then fix the top net <u>and</u> side net together around the top perimeter edge of the framework with cable ties at approximately 10cm apart, *starting at mid-length/mid-width*.



18. Fix the bottom edge of the side net using ground staples at approximately 36cm apart.
